



WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18-25, 2018 Your Right Hand, O Lord, Glorious in Power (Exodus 15:6)



The theme for the 2018 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, "Your Right Hand, O Lord, Glorious in Power," is taken from the book of Exodus 15:6. The resources for this year's Week of Prayer for Christian Unity have been prepared by the churches of the Caribbean by an ecumenical team of women and men under the leadership of His Grace Kenneth Richards, Catholic Archbishop of Kingston, the Antilles Episcopal Conference, together with Mr. Gerard Granado, General Secretary of the Caribbean Conference of Churches.

The Week of Prayer also invites those who participate to use it as an opportunity to examine the effectiveness of the ecumenical movement in seeking to end the divisions among Christians. From the smallest to the largest communities, from all cultures, races and language groups, from all the baptized to all those in ordained ministry, the Week of Prayer is also an opportunity to ask and examine the level of support they have given to this important movement in the life of the Church. An accounting of each Christian's discipleship and faithfulness to the proclamation of the Gospel-the good news of reconciliation-can be taken every year during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

CUCC COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Medford, WI

<u>December 7, 2017</u>

The meeting was called to order by President Randi H. at 5:00 pm. Pastor Mary Jo L. offered a prayer of guidance.

Present: Randi H., Mike G.-P., Linda N., Dawn B., Joyce P., Gail P., Pam O., Pastor Mary Jo L., Linda R. and Sandy K.

Absent: Jerry G.-P.

Secretary's report: The minutes from the November meeting were emailed for review prior to tonight's meeting. Dawn B. made a motion to accept the minutes. Linda N. made a second to the motion. Motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's report:</u> A copy of the November checkbook register was distributed and discussed. Linda N. made a motion to accept the report. Sandy K. made a second to the motion. Motion passed. A motion was made by Linda N., seconded by Joyce P., to take some money out of our checking account and put it into the General Funds Savings. Motion passed.

<u>Pastor's report</u>: Pastor Mary Jo L. was very thankful for her new office chair. She reviewed her month's activities in her written report. There will be letters sent out for Christmas/Advent services to those we haven't seen for a while. She would like to resume a Bible study group again sometime in January. We have several people who are interested in becoming members of our church.

<u>Group and committee reports:</u> The light in the parking lot has been fixed. Repair of the leaking in the furnace room has not occurred yet, but is still on the agenda, while we wait to purchase the material needed. The list of Committee and Auxiliary Organizations was reviewed and updated for the annual meeting. It was decided to add a combined group of Communications and Five Practices.

<u>Old business:</u> Mike G.-P. will send out letters to the congregation by January 9, 2018, announcing the annual meeting date of January 28. Special committee reports for the annual meeting are due by January 4. Annual reports may be picked up in the church beginning on January 14.

<u>New business</u>: Backup secretary duty was discussed. Pam O. is willing to become knowledgeable about the basics in the case that the current secretary wants or needs to have time off. Scrip must be paid for upon receipt. Christmas gifts for special staff members will be discussed in our closed session this evening.

<u>Other business:</u> To our knowledge, our commercial oven still has not been checked. Joyce P. will recheck the issue with K & B Refrigeration. It was questioned whether or not money from the 21st Century Foundation might be transferred to the Building Fund. We will confer with that committee before the annual meeting.

<u>Closed session:</u> The Lord's Prayer was recited by all in attendance before the Council members went into a closed session at 6:22 pm.

Adjournment: Linda R. made a motion to adjourn. Dawn B. made a second to the motion. Motion passed and meeting adjourned at 6:52 pm.
