Dear friends in Christ,

Over the weekend I came across a compelling piece in The Atlantic written by Peter Wehner. "The Evangelical church is breaking apart: Christians must reclaim Jesus from his church" addresses a phenomenon many of us in mainline congregations also are experiencing. Conflicts over COVID protocols, deep political polarization, and a renewed racial justice push prompted by the death of George Floyd have contributed to a growing tribalism in congregational life.

Wehner is an Evangelical Christian who served in the administrations of Ronald Reagan, George H.W. Bush and George W. Bush. He concisely frames the problem: "The aggressive, disruptive and unforgiving mindset that characterizes so much of our politics has found a home in many American churches."

The article's subtitle is eerily similar to the title of Robin Meyers' prophetic 2009 book, "Saving Jesus from the Church," in which Meyers implored us to "to stop worshipping Christ and start following Jesus." Wehner warns about an idolatrous fusion of religion and politics that blatantly ignores the core message of the Bible.

Wehner writes: "When the Christian faith is politicized, churches become repositories not of grace but of grievances, places where tribal identities are reinforced, where fears are nurtured, and where aggression and nastiness are sacralized. This result is not only wounding the nation; it's having a devastating impact on the Christian faith."

All this should prompt us to reclaim our essential calling as disciples – to share the love of Jesus in all we say and do. Ministry is hard work right now, with lots of land mines to navigate. There's no better time to remember that Jesus didn't call us to agree with one another on every issue – he called us to care for one another in acts of compassion and to deal mercifully even with those who are hard to love. This modeling of a grace-filled beloved community nourishes souls and invites people to live in the life-giving ways of Christ.

These beautiful words ring so true for Outdoor Ministry. At Cedar Valley, Daycholah Center, and Moon Beach, we have been moving with reverence toward the changing light, the glow of the leaves, the clarity of the night sky. It truly is magical. We invite you to come and experience this magic.

Speaking of walking on sacred ground, in a few days, we will officially rededicate Daycholah Center. The ceremony will take place on Indigenous Peoples' Day and will include speakers representing the Ho-Chunk Nation, the Hocak United Church of Christ, the Wisconsin Conference United Church of Christ, and UCCI. Cordell Funmaker will provide songs and drums and Bryan Sirchio will lead us with music. There will be a fire circle with a presentation of the Ho-Chunk Nation flag and a shared meal.

They spent their lives pastoring without asking a lot financially from their beloved churches, providing for the needs of family and children on their salaries, but sometimes having not enough left over each week to save for a comfortable retirement. So when there is a sudden change in rent or utilities, unexpected car repairs, difficulties caused by Covid, medical emergencies or they need expensive medical equipment like hearing aids, life can get pretty scary for clergy/lay retirees as well as low-income pastors.

We know that seeing the grateful relief expressed in letters thanking the Pension Boards for stepping in to help fill those gaps with the gifts we and our churches give to the Christmas Fund (this year December 19th.) In 2019, nationally,

- \$1,347,419 was given to 350 persons to bring their household income up to minimum level so they can provide for basic needs
- \$123,727 was provided to 69 individuals and families that face unforeseen circumstances.
- Health Premium supplements totaling \$374,577 were provided to 144 persons.
- And at Christmas time, \$260, 500 in "Thank you" gift checks given to 521 retired UCC clergy/lay employees.


Community Mission With Jesus is an inter-denominational, non-profit ministry seeking to help people of all races, creeds, colors, languages, and nationalities.


