Pastor Tamara shared Maundy Thursday (Passover) with us by serving Communion and symbolically washing of congregants hands.

































#### **Window Restoration**

On April 22, 2024, Nathan Meyer of Art Factory America (Medford, WI) completed the restoration and reinstallation of the more than 100 year old CUCC front stained glass windows. The conservation and restoration work began on January 22, 2024. Each piece was disassembled/deconstructed, cleaned/ polished, restored/recut with replacement glass, epoxied, glazed, soldered/cemented, moldings remade and finally reinstalled. 


#### J.A.M. Activities (enjoying the nice weather outside in the parking lot)
